

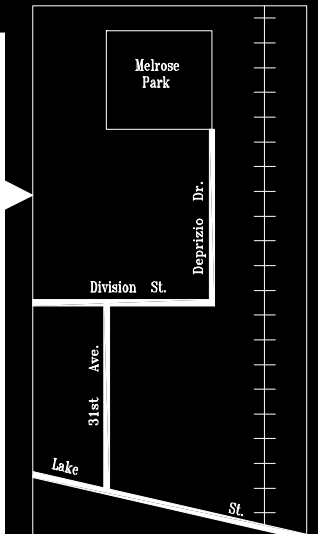

Chicago Section AIHA Asthma Seminar

Asthma is a chronic respiratory disease characterized by inflammation of the airways, and increased responsiveness to various stimuli commonly called asthma triggers.

Asthma episodes involve progressively worsening shortness of breath, cough, wheezing or chest tightness, or some combination of these symptoms. The severity of asthma may range from mild to life-threatening.

An estimated 14.6 million persons in the United States have asthma.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported a 61 percent increase in asthma rate between 1982 and 1994.

According to the American Lung Association, more than 5,600 people die of asthma in the U.S. annually. This represents a 45.3 percent increase in mortality between 1985 and 1995.

The death rate for black Americans is almost three times that of whites. Among chronic illnesses in children, asthma is the most common. Approximately 33 percent of asthma patients are under the age of 18.

Occupational asthma has become the most prevalent work-related lung disease in developed countries. The exact proportion of newly diagnosed cases of asthma is unknown. Up to 15% of asthma cases in the U.S. may have job-related factors.
